



Dear Parishioners and Friends,

We hope you and your families are doing well in this Covid-19 pandemic. Even though a vaccination for this virus is underway, we all heard the news that the speed of manufacturing, shipping and administering the vaccine is way short of the initial plan. Barring any unseen future development plan, this will have an impact on our fundraising events for 2021.

Overall, we had a fairly successful 2020 fundraising events. The Raffle Ticket sales was a successful event, the Ads Book was extremely rewarding in revenue. The Giving Tuesday donations were very generous and exceeded our expectations. I want to personally thank all the people who have volunteered and contributed to these events. The entire parish is grateful for the work you have done in 2020.

Looking down the road for 2021, we see many businesses are deeply affected by the continuous lock down and opening restrictions. Our parishioners are worried about the Covid-19 impact on their well being and finances. We don't know yet if the mutation of the virus is going to hinder or affect the vaccine efficacy. Worldwide we notice and see increased restrictions on travels and extended local lock downs well into the Spring of this year.

For short term, we should focus on the liturgical prayers for the Lent Season, Holy Week and Easter while completing the construction of our rectory planned for end of March 2021.

For long term, we should wait until the end of April before we make any commitment for a 2021 Gala. It will be a very high risk if we make any commitment through a reservation or deposit for the 2021 Gala at the present time.


We will be monitoring the situation for the next three months and will seek your opinion and recommendation for our next steps in regard for future fundraising events. Stay healthy and safe.

# LITURGICALLY SPEAKING

Recently someone asked me if someone who is not a Catholic can go to heaven; what if a person is not a Christian, can they go to heaven. Certainly, as Catholics we believe that salvation comes through Jesus Christ. The Word made flesh, the Son of God, died for our sins so that we would not have to pay the price of death, but have eternal life. In this Gospel, we are provided a context in which to understand this teaching. Sometimes people are saved by someone they don't know; a stranger that happened to be there to pull them out of the water before they drowned; a quick thinking stranger who knew what to do when someone is choking or needed emergency care.

There are a variety of ways in which saving acts can be accomplished by an unnamed person. There are people who do not reject the actions of compassion and mercy. In this is the story here. There are people who know the story of Jesus, they believe in Him in an emotional and intellectual way but they may be actually rejecting the essence of who He is in this Gospel. The hungry, the naked, the imprisoned, the thirsty, those who need to be welcomed.

There are those who can't believe in Jesus because of the self-righteousness and hypocrisy of some professing Christians. They might be rigid fundamentalists who take the Scriptures literally, but when it comes to this parable, they place so many conditions that they are no longer seeing Jesus, but are blind, not able to see through their judgments. There is a danger in separating faith from works. One without the other is haphazard ideals or brittle laws. Leave it up to Jesus to sort through the complexity of humanness. He knows when He is hungry and thirsty and who responded.

## **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Today the Maronite Church celebrates the Sunday of the Righteous and the Just. This is actually the traditional Maronite feast in honor of all the saints. Whereas the Latin Church celebrates the feast of All Saints on November 1st, the Maronite Church, following its ancient tradition dedicates this Sunday in their memory.

On this day, we call to mind all the men and women, children of the Church, who have followed the path of justice and righteousness. We remember the prophets, apostles and martyrs, the hermits, ascetics, men and women religious, as well as all Christians who have led holy lives. As our Liturgy so often reminds us, they are just in the sight of God because they have patterned their lives on Jesus Christ, the just One.

The saints are our models; their prayers and fasting have taught us to fight against sin and temptation and so gain the reward of righteousness. The saints are our intercessors; by their prayers we obtain the pardon of our sins and are strengthened in the Christian virtues. They were the salt of the earth and the light of the world, they call us to follow their path. Through their intercession may we one day merit eternal life with God.

#### LENT 2021

Lent this year will start on Monday, February 15th with Ash Monday. The Liturgy will be celebrated with Blessing and Distribution of Ashes at 9:00 AM, 12:00 PM and 7:00 PM.

Every Friday during Lent, beginning February 19th through Friday, March 26th, we will pray the Stations and Benediction of the Cross at 7:00 PM in the Church. Friday, April 2nd is Friday of the Passion of the Lord.

#### LENTEN OBSERVANCES

All Maronites who are physically capable are to abstain from meat on Ash Monday (February15, 2021) and all Fridays of Lent.

Ash Monday and Good Friday of the Crucifixion are also days of fasting. Fasting in the Maronite Church involves eating and drinking nothing at all (except water and medicine) from midnight until noon.
