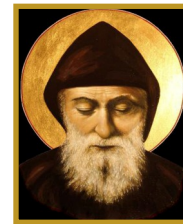

**CHORBISHOP ALFRED'S HOMILY
PREACHED AT THE MEMORIAL MASS OF
HIS BELOVED FATHER, MR. ALBERT BADAWI
SUNDAY, JULY 24, 2022**

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today we offer the Holy Mass for the repose of the soul of my dear departed father, Albert, together with my brother, Wahib and my niece, Ramella.

When we lose a loved one, we read and go deeply into his or her biography in the light of God's words upon which we turn our eyes, to take example from their life, and get ready before the hour comes.

We listened to the Bible reading and St. Paul's letter which talk about Christ's resurrection.

Our Christian faith is strongly grounded in His resurrection, and if the passion of Christ and His sufferings remind us of misery, then His resurrection promises the joy of the life to come.

Let us work hard in the present life and have hope in the future, for today is the time for us to work, and tomorrow we shall be rewarded according to our works.

Since there is no escape from death, and since our human life is nothing more than that interval between childhood and old-age, we will only find salvation in Christ who died for us and favored us with the hope of resurrection.

Given that death is certain and inevitable in this life that we are rushing through, and given that this life that we admire and hold on to can't be perennial, let us take shelter in He who has promised us eternity.

Saint Ignatius says:" Come let us contemplate God's promise - a happy eternal life. But reality is different. Unfortunately, life is sad. Don't we all know how sad it is? Can we hide this actuality? Life is loaded with surprises and crises that haunt us. Disputes, fights, trials, and ignorance in people's thoughts, that we sometimes embrace the enemy and fear our friends without recognizing."

In the world we live in, there is hunger, homelessness, heat, cold, envy and distress. Yes, even though life is extremely sad and dreary, we would all wish it lasted forever if we had the chance. Don't we all say, "I want to stay as i am, death by itself disturbs me?"

If you desire to reach this eternal joy and live a happy life, choose the path of goodness, righteousness and love in this impermanent life, and you'll hear the Lord saying: "Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master's happiness".

Our dear father, Albert, departed this life at the age of 87. He lived in his hometown since his childhood, and after he had married his life partner our beloved late mother Mona who passed away on February 7, 2021, they had 6 boys: Wajih, Ernest, Alfred, Joe, Wahib and Bahjat. Together, they planted among their boys seeds of sincere familial, devotional and national spirit.

Our father was consoled and happy with his boys who made their way to life, succeeded in their works, and made families, and he was proud of them. Their successes solaced him, and compensated for the hard times and bitter days he lived, always relying on God as the bible says: "Whoever trusts in the Lord is safe."

He hunched over his grandchildren complying with the saying: "The most beloved of children are the children of one's children." He was an affectionate father, intensely attached to his grandchildren whom he saw grow and progress in life, armed with knowledge, education, ethics and spiritual commitment, while he treasured the kinship ties with his brothers and sisters and their families and maintained strong bonds with his in-laws. Moreover, his various preoccupations and interests never took him away from taking care of his family.

He was a genuine Douarian who loved his hometown Douar, flesh and stone, and he was a historical reference, knowledgeable of its old history's smallest details. He took care of it after he came back following the 80's war. While he was a member of the endowment committee, he renovated the old Saint Antonios church from the outside and the inside, he rebuilt and restored the church's dome that was bombed during the war, he also renewed the old school, and he sought to buy the piece of land and lay the foundation stone of the hall which he began to construct and inaugurated with the committee and under the blessing of the sovereign Bishop Yousef Beshara, Father Charbel Raad the parish priest and the parishioners.

All those who met or worked with my father loved him, the same way he loved those he dealt with. He accompanied the poor and the needy, for he knew that he was doing the works of righteousness and humanity as recommended by the divine teacher, with compassion, modesty and simplicity, and his left hand never knew what his right hand was doing.

Two weeks before his death, he received the Holy Eucharist with firm Christian hope, and this shows his faith and the family's faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, and proves the family's commitment to the acceptance of the holy sacraments.

Hence, we hope that God will reward our father in His holy kingdom for the great qualities he had, the deeds and services he offered to his people, for his profound marital life and praiseworthy parenthood. May he also reward him for the prayers he said and the holy sacraments he accepted until his last breath.

On behalf of my brothers and their families, our attendees coming from far and near to celebrate the Memorial Mass of our dear loving Father Albert. May God grant our father eternal rest and comfort, and may He bless you all with a peaceful life full of goodness by the grace of the holy trinity, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.
