

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Because of the pandemic, at the celebration of the Mass. social distancing, hand sanitizer, and masks are required. We have a limited amount of available seats up to 220 because of the policy of keeping households seated six feet apart. You must wear a mask to enter through the main entrance and the north entrance of the Church building. When you arrive, you will be greeted and led to a seat.

Please be flexible and patient as we try to make use of the early birds system and navigate through the health and safety protocol and guidelines. This may also mean that you won't be sitting in your usual spot.

The bishop's dispensation from the Sunday obligation is still in effect. It may seem awkward, but this is a step to return to the celebration of the sacraments during a rather uncertain time. Please be patient, charitable, and prudent, and let us continue to pray for the health and well-being of our community, first responders, and healthcare workers.

On Monday, June 22nd, we will have a special outdoor Mass in honor of Saint Sharbel. It is very important to reinstate the monthly devotions to Saint Sharbel.

Again, if you are more comfortable by attending in your cars please do so. Even though we will be outdoors, masks will be required. I ask that you bring lawn or folding chairs from your home.

We will conclude with the prayers of the Chaplet of Saint Sharbel and benediction with his relics. Mass will begin at 7:00 PM. The celebrant will be Father Sameem Balius, the Pastor of Sacred Heart Chaldean Catholic Church in Warren, MI.

If the weather is inclement, we will use the Church. Please remember that social distancing is essential and enforced at all of our functions on the grounds and inside of the Church. We must work cooperatively in order to stop this COVID-19 and keep everyone safe. It is our responsibility to do so.

With the pandemic situation many people have lost their jobs and are in dire need. Some of our parishioners have already responded to the need and we have received both groceries cards and monetary donations. On behalf of those who have benefited from your generosity, hank you ever so much!

I would like to thank all of you in advance for your continued help and assistance when needed. May God continue to bless and keep you healthy and safe and sound.





STUDENT ARTICLE

My fellow Parishioners,

Hello, my name is Carolyn Peters and I am a Class of 2020 graduate from Dakota High School in Macomb, MI. I have been attending 4:00 p.m. Saturday Mass with my family for as long as I can remember. I am incredibly blessed and honored to be writing this article and to share my personal experiences of my senior year during this unprecedented time. Leading up to the month of March 2020, my senior year was going as I had envisioned: I was enjoying every day, attending Mass weekly, catching a bad case of "senioritis," completing a clinical student internship at Henry Ford Macomb Hospital, and even preparing to coordinate wedding ceremonies at the Italian American Cultural Center. With all of these exciting challenges and big plans for the future, I often thought to myself, "Wow, life really cannot get much better than this."

In early March, I attended a healthcare State Leadership Conference in Traverse City with over 2,000 students from Michigan. We traveled by bus and were packed in a crowded conference room with no thought of social distancing whatsoever. I would soon learn that life would never be the same again. I returned to school on March 11th and began to realize that the Coronavirus was at the forefront of everyone's mind. Little did I know then that I only had three days left of high school. During this week, Governor Whitmer announced the closure of all public schools for three weeks. Three weeks soon turned into the remainder of my senior year for my fellow classmates and me. After hearing this devastating news, I felt my heart shatter into a million pieces. In my eyes, the world was completely upside down; however, I began to find solace in the Lord and pray that this living nightmare would soon be over.

As the Coronavirus pandemic began to cause worry, fear, and uncertainty in the world, my classmates and I were absolutely heartbroken as well. Looking for ways to cope with the grief of not having a senior spring break trip, prom, graduation ceremony, honors night, official goodbye to our classmates and teachers, and walk through of our elementary schools in our caps and gowns, I learned numerous, valuable life lessons. I soon learned to cherish every moment, live life with a grateful heart, and be present in the moment with family and friends. I missed going to Mass with my family and hearing inspirational and uplifting homilies from Chorbishop Alfred and Deacon Mike. Sitting in my living room with my parents and siblings and watching Mass virtually was comforting and provided a sense of normality, but it was not the same. Looking back over these past three months, I discovered how important it is to appreciate the experiences that life brings because life can change with the blink of an eye and so much can be taken away from you so fast.

Two weeks ago, for the first time since March 7, 2020, I was finally able to return back to Mass at St. Sharbel. It was both scary and comforting at the same time. In an attempt to get some normality back into my life, I felt relieved and at peace with myself surrounded by my family and fellow parishioners. Towards the end of the Mass, Chorbishop reached out to me from the altar and recognized me as a Class of 2020 high school graduate. I wonder if he realizes that his words were a great inspiration to me and in that moment, I knew that everything would be okay. It is crucial to remain faithful and hopeful to God and that even when you feel as if the world is turning on you, God has a plan in store for you and is always there with you. I never anticipated my senior year to take the path that it did, but I am graduating with a brighter future, greater resilience, and love for all. Thank you.


