

2024 NAM QUESTIONS

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT NAM

- 1. How do I find out about the NAM package options for the convention? Information packets are being mailed to all NAM Members and registered parishioners of St. Sharbel Church. If you do not receive a packet in the mail, there will be forms and brochures in the back of church, or find more details at www.NAMNews.org.
- 2. <u>Is there a package that includes the hotel?</u> All NAM packages are separate from the hotel rooms. There is a discount for anyone attending the Convention (local or from out of state) but the convention packages are sold separate from the hotel rooms.
- 3. <u>Do you have to be a NAM Member to receive the Hotel Discount?</u> No anyone signing up to attend the NAM convention can receive the hotel discount just use the code provided on the brochure.
- 4. Who can attend the Dinner/Celebration Thursday, July 4th at St. Sharbel? Anyone who buys a ticket to the event can attend. People coming in from out of town will buy the Thursday to Sunday package which includes the party Thursday evening at St. Sharbel. Transportation options are listed on the registration form. Anyone local wanting to attend can buy tickets watch the bulletin for details, as this is subject to availability and capacity.
- 5. How can I help if I do not want to drive downtown? We are working on transportation each day (Thursday, Friday and Saturday) from 8 am to 5 pm for those who do not want to drive alone. Volunteers are needed for the Registration Desk, Welcoming Committee, Hospitality. Transportation and Excursions. Also, we will need volunteers for the Thursday night celebration at St. Sharbel Church set up, clean up, gift shop, keeping the church clean, etc. Contact the church office if you would like to volunteer to help with any of these duties.
- 6. How can I help if I don't want to go downtown at all that week? Sponsorship opportunities exist for all 'host parish' events Hospitality, transportation, lunches, Auction Items, excursions, etc. Contact the church office if you'd like to donate for any of these festivities.
- 7. <u>Should locals buy a package?</u> Yes this is a Maronite Convention open to everyone! There will be hundreds of people traveling from other cities and a perfect opportunity to meet new people and catch up with old acquaintances. The hotel stay is optional for locals.
- 8. Should I encourage my young adult children to attend? Absolutely several married couples met at conventions just like this! This will be a long weekend full of Spiritual, Social and Professional interaction. Don't miss it!
- 9. Are there activities for children under 12 years old? Yes NAM conventions are for Maronites of all ages most activities are scheduled for MYO, MYA, Seniors and Adults, but we try to plan events for everyone. There will be a Children's Activity during the speaking engagements so parents can attend.
- 10. <u>Can locals attend the excursions?</u> Yes anyone can attend the convention and the excursions see registration materials for details. NAM members get a discount off the price of the convention package.





DEACON'S CORNER

To begin this week's DC, I want to mention that time just seems to be on the fast track. Hard to believe that it is March, 2024 already. It is 4AM on this past Saturday morning and I have been up since 1:30AM. After reading this week's bulletin from St. Sharbel Maronite Catholic Church in Michigan, whose pastor is my very dear friend and mentor, now Bishop Alfred Badawi, I read this week's gospel of Lk 11-32, the gospel of the Prodigal Son. I have to make this the subject of this week's DC, so here we go.

The beginning of this story is when then Fr. Alfred was pastor at Our Lady of Lebanon in Lombard, IL and we were renting a church (Queen of Heaven), while beginning construction of our new church in Lombard. At that time a good friend, Ed Lebbos, asked Bobbi and I to come to Mass with him and the gospel that Sunday happened to be the Prodigal Son. While listening to the gospel and homily from Fr. Alfred, I was moved. Moved to understand that "I had been lost but now I am found" and realized that this is the place I need to be to enhance my own spiritual growth and Fr. Alfred was to be my mentor. You see, I had known Fr. Alfred from the time he was stationed at St. Maron's Church in Detroit and he had done a funeral and 40 day Mass for my Aunt Margaret and Bobbi and I, while living in Chicago, attended both and I told Bobbi at both services that "I really like Fr. Alfred". He was moved to Lombard to build our new church which we did together and then was moved back to the Detroit area to build another new church which we also did together. I believe Fr. Alfred, now Bishop Alfred, is what I call a "fixer". What I mean by that is Bishop Alfred's superiors understand that when a parish is in need of "fixing", Alfred is the man to get the job done. And his last endeavor, the St. Sharbel campus in Clinton Township is a monument to Bishop Alfred's ability and I believe has the largest and most active congregation in the Maronite Church in the US.

It was on this Prodigal Sunday, many years ago, that I told then Fr. Alfred that "I am home", and asked how I can increase my spiritual journey. After I completed my sub-diaconate training and began serving the altar and my priest, I asked Fr. Alfred when he was now in Chicago, what my next step to become more attached to Our Lord. He said; "you can study to become a Deacon". So he and I went to the Mundelien Seminary in Libertyville and I enrolled in the Diaconate Program. After years of study, I was ordained a Deacon in the Maronite Church by Bishop Shaheen, now deceased and may he RIP. Bishop Alfred and I have been traveling to Lebanon together every year, with the exception of covid, and I saw many of my relatives as my father was one of thirteen children, only three of which came to the US. By the way, my father died on his first trip back to Lebanon in

1965 at the age of 59. He hadn't been home since he came here 47 years earlier in 1919 at the age of 12. I was able to see the house where he grew up and spoke with many relatives still in Lebanon. I brought back a large piece of concrete from the floor of my dad's bedroom which was bombed during the war in the 70s in Lebanon.

I want to complete this DC by recognizing Bishop Alfred as my blessing from Our Lord who has helped me in so many ways to grow my spiritual life, so I say: "I love you, Abouna, and thank you".


