



REFLECTION FOR TODAY

Lord, most of us find ourselves in uncharted territory. Each of us would like to think we know what tomorrow holds, but we truly do not. As the reality of life under the threat of coronavirus continues to unfold, please help us remember that...

For every person who makes light of the situation, there may be a person who struggles with crippling anxiety trying to maintain a sense of calm with the onslaught of conflicting opinions.

For every person deciding not to take part in social distancing, there may be a doctor or nurse urgently preparing for and contemplating the monumental task facing them as well as the very real threat to their own health.

For every comment minimizing the dignity of each human person by writing off the majority of its victims as "just the elderly", there may be a senior citizen without necessary supplies because they are terrified to leave the house in fear for their life.

For every student celebrating an extended break from school, there may be a special needs child left without essential services and a consistent schedule, which they desperately need to thrive.

For every parent happy to have kids home from school, there may a parent without a support system in need of childcare or a teacher worried about students who do not have a stable home life or enough food Altar, have taken on a new meaning to me: to eat.

For every parent celebrating the return of their children from college, there may be a college student struggling with missing out on exciting milestones such as a passion for learning, young love, community, and graduation. While these may seem unimportant to mature adults, how soon we forget that this meant the world to us at their age.

For every person with an overflowing grocery cart, there may be a person working overtime stocking shelves with little time to do their own grocery shopping, or a small restaurant owner concerned about how they will pay their bills as customers dwindle.

For every person with the ability to work remotely, there may be a person who will be without a paycheck because their job requires their physical presence.

For every person leaning on God through the Sacraments, prayer, fasting, and reading of the Holy Bible, there may be a person who struggles with belief in God, particularly when faced with suffering.

Dearest, Lord, in the midst of all these authentic human responses, help us to remember that in the end we are all part of one, big human family. You have lovingly created us in your image and likeness; and we are all called to love in response. Show each of us what that love should look like, whether it be simple or great; and give us the humility to put others needs before our own. Remind us that we do not know the intentions or pain of another. We truly cannot judge their heart . . . that is your job. Above all, please be merciful to us, and help us remember that you are

always with us, whether we are aware of it or not. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

My Dear Parishioners,

During this time of trial I reach out to you and urge you to pray that those who have been infected with the virus will be healed. How fitting it is during this time of Lent when we are experiencing all of the restrictions we are being asked to follow, to take the time to draw closer to our Lord in prayer, alone and together as a family. Pray the powerful prayers of the Rosary, read Scripture, and talk to God from your heart about your concerns and worries; these are the most beautiful prayers outside of the Sacraments.


